CSC RESOLUTION NO. 003-93

RELATIVE TO COMMENDING GERALD A. TAITANO FOR HIS DEDICATED SERVICES TO THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION AND GOVERNMENT OF GUAM, AND WISHING HIM WELL IN FUTURE ENDEAVORS

- WHEREAS,** GERALD A. TAITANO was appointed by the Governor as a Member of the Civil Service Commission on April 18, 1991 and his appointment expired on May 4, 1993; and
- WHEREAS,** because of work and family demands, Gerald A. Taitano informed the Governor that regretfully he would not be available for reappointment; and
- WHEREAS,** the functions of the Civil Service Commission are varied and complex and the duties and responsibilities undertaken by Gerald A. Taitano were correspondingly difficult and complex; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano provided leadership and direction to the Commission in expanding the number of regular meeting nights each week to as many as five when necessary; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano's leadership enabled the Commission in moving forward and disposing of a high volume of cases despite conflicting priorities and multitudinous requests for continuance by the respective parties in adjudication cases; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano was an effective spokesman before the Legislature in providing testimony on the GovGuam Comprehensive Classification and Compensation Study (Hay Study), the operation of the Civil Service Commission and various proposed bills; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano was elected as Chairperson of the Civil Service Commission by his fellow Commissioners on May 27, 1992 and continued to fill this vital position through completion of his term as Commissioner; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano strove diligently to reduce the backlog of adjudication cases before the Commission and was successful in doing so; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano spent considerable personal effort and time in developing his own opening statements and explanations which succinctly summarized matters before the Commission; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano was fully prepared for Commission hearings which necessitated sacrificing considerable personal and family time which he was not compensated for; and
- WHEREAS,** Gerald A. Taitano served the Civil Service Commission with professionalism and pride bringing distinction to the Commission; and

WHEREAS, Gerald A. Taitano will be missed professionally, socially, and personally; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Civil Service Commission hereby commends GERALD A. TAITANO for his dedicated service and significant contributions to the Government of Guam and the Civil Service Commission, and wish him the best in his future endeavors; and be it further
