

CSC RESOLUTION NO. 88-015

RELATIVE TO UPGRADING EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN - AMBULANCE (EMT-A) PERSONNEL GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION:

- WHEREAS, the EMS Regulations approved pursuant to Public Law 14-11 (EMS Act) requires EMT-A's, in order to become certified and re-certified, to acquire 112 hours of additional training every two years beyond the requirements of a regular firefighter; and
- WHEREAS, due to budgetary limitations, the EMT-A puts in these hours on their own time; and
- WHEREAS, the EMT-A's perform critical services in saving lives and preventing and relieving pain and suffering; and
- WHEREAS, there is a need to develop an Incentive program to encourage Guam Fire Department personnel to get certification or recertification as EMT-A; and
- WHEREAS, Guam Fire Department has only thirty (30) Firefighter 1's working as EMT-A's of which 73% have less than two years experience; and eighty-seven firefighters who were at one time certified EMT-A have been decertified since 1980; and
- WHEREAS, when responding to call outs, the EMT-A's are at greater risk from communicable diseases due to the trauma cases they handle, i.e., danger of Aids, Tuberculosis, Meningitis and other communicable diseases; and
- WHEREAS, EMT-A services are required by the public by about ten to one over the services required for fire suppression responses which indicates a very high demand for EMT-A services; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, the Civil Service Commission requests the Nineteenth Guam Legislature to enact legislation which authorizes a firefighter in the Guam Fire Department who performs work as a certified Emergency Medical Technician Ambulance (EMT-A) to be paid a differential pay calculated at the rate of his regular wage plus fifteen percent (15%) for all periods he is assigned as a certified EMT-A and is a certified EMT-A.
