CSC RESOLUTION NO. 89-012



RELATIVE TO SUPPORTING THE CONVERSION OF THE CIVILIAN POSITIONS AND INCUMBENT EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS FROM UNCLASSIFIED TO CLASSIFIED.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION:

WHEREAS, 4 GCA §4101 provides that employment in the Government of Guam shall be based on merit; and

WHEREAS, the Civil Service Commission supports the application of the merit system to as many government positions as practicable; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Military Affairs through the Adjutant General of the National Guard, Edward G. Perez, BG, has submitted a request to support the conversion of civilian positions and incumbent employees; and

WHEREAS, the staff of the Civil Service Commission conducted a classification audit of the civilian positions and respective incumbents and findings were transmitted to the Adjutant General on January 20, 1989; and

WHEREAS, it is the Civil Service Commission's understanding that the request of the Adjutant General to classify positions and incumbent employees is supported by Governor Joseph F. Ada; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Civil Service Commission approves the request of the Adjutant General and adopts this resolution supporting the conversion of the civilian positions and the respective incumbent employees of the Department of Military Affairs as identified in the classification report of the Civil Service Commission dated January 20, 1989, and attached hereto as Exhibit 1; be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature amend 4 GCA §4101 (14) to exclude the civilian positions identified by this Resolution and other positions that thereafter may be determined as civilian-classified by the Department of Military Affairs in conjunction with the Civil Service Commission; and further amend §40001 of the Government Code, as re-enacted by P.L. 16-18, to reflect the status of classified civilian employees of the Department; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and Lt. Governor; the Speaker, Vice-Speaker, and Senators of the 20th Guam Legislature; and the Adjutant General of the National Guard.
