#### I. INTRODUCTION

COMES NOW, the Department of Education (DOE or Management), by and through Phyllis Blas, Lay Representative, and hereby submits this Motion to Dismiss as follows:

#### II. PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

The above-captioned matter (17-GRE13) arises from the findings related to a Grievance Appeal submitted by Employee Eleuterio J. Mesa to the DOE Superintendent of Education on May 30, 2017. Mesa elevated the appeal to the Civil Service Commission (CSC) at the Step 4 level on June 28, 2017. DOE now moves to dismiss Mesa's appeal because it is substantially

Presumably, based on this inquiry about J.P. Torres' status, Mesa claims that he should receive a high school principal's pay.

Specifically, in an e-mail to Santos dated April 14, 2017, Mesa states: "As we were discussing the settlement of my CSC cases last year, I did mention to Mr. Fernandez that I must be paid a high school principal's pay for the school year 2015-2016." See Attachment 01 to Mesa's 17-GRE13 Step 1 Grievance.

This claim in the 17-GRE13 Grievance (for high school principal pay based on J.P. Torres' "conversion") was already made in the 17-GRE05 Step 1 Grievance dated January 31, 2017, filed three months earlier.

Specifically, the third paragraph of the 17-GRE05 Step 1 Grievance states: "While I was discussing with Superintendent Fernandez about my demotion and termination back pay, I proposed to be paid as a high school principal for school year 2015-2016. To date, I never got a feedback on the issue."

In addition, Mesa already mentioned the "conversion" of J.P. Torres in the 17-GRE05 Step 1 Grievance, which he connected to his claim of "Demotion of HS [high school] Principal to MS [middle school] Principal," the title of his 17-GRE05 Step 1 Grievance.

Specifically, the first paragraph of the 17-GRE05 Step 1 Grievance states: "During the summer of 2015, JP Torres Alternative School was converted to JP Torres Alternative High School."

Furthermore, the remedy that Mesa seeks in 17-GRE13 is exactly the same as the remedy he already sought in 17-GRE05.

Specifically, in the 17-GRE13 Grievance, Mesa asks for, "2. Back pay as a High School Principal from August 2015 to the Present."

This is the same relief sought in the 17-GRE05 Grievance, where Mesa previously asked for, "3. Because Superintendent Fernandez converted JP Torres Alternative School to JP Torres Alternative High School Principal [sic], it is only right that I be given a high school principal's pay from August 2015 to the present."

On April 24, 2017, Mesa wrote a Memorandum to the Executive Director of the CSC, Peter S. Calvo, informing the CSC that effective immediately his 17-GRE05 Grievance would be withdrawn.

Mesa's 17-GRE05 Grievance was later dismissed with prejudice per the CSC's Judgment of Dismissal on May 11, 2017.

Despite this, Mesa submitted his 17-GRE13 Step 1 Grievance, repeating his claim for high school principal pay based on J.P. Torres' status on April 28, 2017.

The CSC should not allow Mesa to re-file basically the same Grievance that he already voluntarily dismissed with prejudice.

2. Management contends that numerous Exhibits provided in Mesa's already dismissed 17-GRE05 Grievance were also resubmitted in support of his 17-GRE13 Grievance.

In addition to having the same basis as his 17-GRE05 Grievance (described above), Mesa's 17-GRE13 Grievance is also supported by the same documents that were already submitted with the earlier 17-GRE05 Grievance.

As seen above, Mesa's use of the same documents to support both his 17-GRE05 Grievance and the 17-GRE13 Grievance demonstrates again that he has filed basically the same thing.

The CSC should not allow Mesa to do this.

#### IV. RELIEF

For the forgoing reasons, the Department of Education finds that a dismissal of this Employee's Grievance Appeal is fully warranted in this instance and hereby respectfully requests that the Commissioners enter a decision and order in the record dismissing this case with prejudice.
