Public Employee Protection Act, Rule 10, requires the employee who feels aggrieved by the retaliatory action as described in 4 GCA, §4502(b) by the appointing authority or supervisor for alleging a violation of 4 GCA, §4503 must file a complaint in writing with the Personnel Board, ...within twenty (20) days of the action. The Employee had up until July 23, 2017 to meet the deadline. Mr. Diaz filed his complaint on March 19, 2019, and has therefore had not filed a timely complaint.
